### **Downtown Hollywood's Newest Gem Offers BUBBLE TEA and Great Music**

HOLLYWOOD, FL - July 20th, 2008 - The Megabyte Cyber Café, Downtown Hollywood's Newest Gem, on Young Circle offers live music, karaoke and BUBBLE TEA.

Boasting the sounds of some of South Florida's finest musicians, as well as a state-of-the-art Cyber Room, Megabyte Cyber Café is the unique creation of owner Adam Morgan. This socially infused space is the perfect setting for music and cyber enthusiasts to enjoy an evening of entertainment and a cup of cappuccino or BUBBLE TEA.

BUBBLE TEA is an Asian phenomenon that adds a distinctive atmosphere to Megabyte Cyber Café. It originated in Taiwan and was sold by street vendors to school children seeking a cool, sweet treat after a long day. The refreshing drink is a mixture of iced or hot sweetened tea and milk, shaken together with fruit flavors, to form bubbles. More "bubbles" are made of tapioca, called "pearls" or "balls" which sit at the bottom of the cup and are consumed through large straws.

The Megabyte Cyber Café is located at 1754 S. Young Circle in Downtown Hollywood facing the newly renovated ArtsPark at Young Circle. The café proudly supports local music and will feature an open mic/karaoke night every Friday, and live music every Saturday.

The Hollywood Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) was created under the authority of Florida's Community Redevelopment Act of 1969. The CRA's mission is to encourage economic development through the use of tax increment financing by funding development, special projects and enhanced services that address areas of community concern.
